

Application for Admission: Northern California Innocence Project Clinic 2023-2024

The Northern California Innocence Project (NCIP) clinical program provides a unique educational opportunity for SCU law students to investigate and litigate possible wrongful convictions. NCIP also works to promote legal reforms aimed at remedying the systemic problems within our criminal justice system that lead to wrongful convictions.

Supervised by experienced legal staff, NCIP law students evaluate innocence claims by reviewing case histories, appellate briefs, transcripts, and other records. They participate directly in the investigation process by interviewing prisoners, witnesses, crime lab personnel, law enforcement, defense attorneys, and prosecutors. As part of their case work, NCIP students draft legal documents including motions, declarations, briefs, legal memoranda, and letters to attorneys, clients, and case rounds memos. Students also attend and participate in court proceedings.

If admitted into the program, all NCIP students **are required to attend** an intensive daylong training session known as "NCIP Boot Camp" near the beginning of the fall semester. NCIP clinic students will be expected to be in the NCIP office to attend class and work on cases at least ten hours per week on a schedule to be agreed upon in advance with the supervising attorneys.
